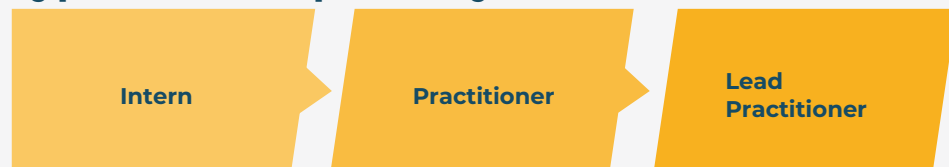
» Soft tissue therapy

APPRENTICESHIPS AND GRADUATE SCHEMES

At Sport Wales we also recognise that people from different backgrounds and experiences may face barriers to getting the qualifications they need to get into the jobs they really want. And we don't think that's fair. So, we've created some opportunities for the people who may face those barriers to get their qualifications while working with us.

DIGITAL APPRENTICESHIPS

Our Digital Apprentices study one day a week at university and work for the other four days at Sport Wales, applying what they have learned in their studies at work. Working as a Digital Apprentice can involve a variety of tasks such as helping people fix IT issues or creating digital content like building websites. During the three-year apprenticeship, our apprentices are paid a full-time salary and at the end of the three years, they will graduate from university with an undergraduate degree in Applied Software Engineering.

INSTITUTE GRADUATE SCHEME

The Institute also offers a graduate scheme to people who have done a Sport Science undergraduate degree and would like to do a specialist master's degree. They study two days a week at university and work for the other three days at Sport Wales, applying what they have learned in their studies at work through supporting different projects. During the two-year graduate scheme, our graduates are paid a full-time salary and at the end of the two years, they will graduate from university with a master's degree in their specialist subject.
